DID YOU KNOW?

Bees play a vital role in our ecosystem by pollinating plants, which helps to produce fruits, vegetables, and other crops. However, bee populations are declining worldwide due to habitat loss, pesticide use, and climate change. This decline in bee populations is a major concern because it could lead to a significant decrease in food production and biodiversity. That's why it's more important than ever to support the bee population, and there are ways you can help them in your yard.

You can plant native wildflowers, herbs, and flowering fruits and vegetables. Plant flowers with continuous blooms and long blooming cycles, avoid pesticides that can harm bees, and provide a water source and at times a little bit of sugar water. Bees need water to survive, just like they need nectar and pollen for food. Providing a water source for bees can help support their survival and health and can also help attract them to your garden for pollination.

You can provide a water source for bees by providing them with a bee bath. What is a bee bath? A bee bath is just a shallow dish or bowl with marbles or stones in it. The stones in the bowl provide a landing pad for the bees to land and rest while they drink. And of course, place the bee bath in a shaded area near your blooming plants.

Our bee populations are under threat, so let's give them all the support we can.

For the **Christian Education Team**, this a calm time – the calm days of summer. And we're going to let them enjoy it aren't we?


The Adult Sunday class is continuing the study and discussions of **The Making of the Bible:** From the First Fragments to Sacred Scripture. Everyone is welcome to come and

"What does Jesus have to say about the nation that kills its children?"

This question, addressed to the General Assembly, echoed through the otherwise silent ballroom on July 2. It was asked by Benjamin Fitzgerald-Fye, one of four commissioners who gave testimony about the effects of gun violence on children in the U.S. The testimonies came before a vote on overture DOE-03, which calls "for action so that children may live free from gun violence."

DOE-03, "An Overture Calling for Action so that Children May Live Free from Gun Violence" passed unanimously.

Overture DOE-o3 proposes seven concrete steps including prayer, gun storage safety, ending gun marketing to children, promoting gun security technology, and voting, and calls upon "every congregation in the PC(USA) to take some specific action of love and responsibility for children as part of the movement to prevent gun violence."

The gathered assembly listened in silence as the four presented impassioned and compelling testimonies, pleading to the church's consciousness, asking hard questions of those assembled, demanding action, listing some of the types of violence that children face daily — in school, at homes, through advertising and marketing, video games, television and other forms of media. The overture, which had been placed on the consent agenda, was pulled so that all present could bear witness to the testimonies.

The overture passed unanimously, 424-0.
