Souper Bowl of Caring

Leading up to the NFL Super Bowl matchup between the Philadelphia Eagles and the Kansas City Chiefs, Henderson's First Presbyterian Church took part in the national Souper Bowl of Caring, running concurrently with a Souper Bowl of Caring drive led by Rusk County 4-H. For about two weeks, members collected nonperishable food for the Henderson Interchurch Ministry. Because of the competitive energy surrounding American football's biggest event of the year, members competed through their donations, by putting their items in a decorated box that corresponded with the team they were cheering for.



Not only was this to add some competition, but also to bolster excitement about fighting food insecurity. Henderson Interchurch Ministry (HIM), located on State Highway 64 in Henderson, provides local families with things like food assistance and help paying utility bills. Fighting food insecurity, which is where individuals and families are without access to adequate, nutritious food, is one of their focuses. There are approximately 8000 food insecure people in Rusk County, according to the nonprofit Feeding America, and HIM is one of the charities working to lower that number.

The Souper Bowl of Caring food drive was started in 1990 by a youth group at Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, SC. The first year, 22 area churches collected \$5,700 for food charities. Since then, the drive, headed by the nonprofit parent organization Tackle Hunger, has expanded across the nation and raised over 200 million dollars to fight food insecurity. This year alone, well over 20 million dollars have been collected, and about 1,500 food charities, including HIM, have been helped. From that church halfway across America 34 years ago to their sister church right here in Henderson, the Souper Bowl of Caring continues to equip groups to support food charities at the local level.
